




6. After the Suspension Order was entered, on October 17, 2022, Respondent underwent a Fitness for Duty Re-Evaluation. The report, dated October 24, 2022, concluded that Respondent is now considered to be psychologically fit for duty without job restrictions. It further found that he is cleared to return to work but will need to first have the suspension on his EMT license lifted.

7. Without waiving its ability to proceed on the remaining allegations in the Complaint, the State of Delaware and Respondent agree that the need for the temporary suspension, namely the findings of the October 4, 2022 Fitness for Duty Evaluation, has changed in that the October 24, 2022 Fitness for Duty Re-Evaluation now reflects he is no longer unfit and is, in fact, psychologically fit and cleared to return to work without job restrictions.

**WHEREFORE**, for the above reasons, the parties jointly request that the Suspension Order against Respondent's Delaware EMT certification be lifted and that the State shall retain all rights to proceed on the remaining allegations in the Complaint.
