**FINAL ORDER**

This is the Final Order of the Delaware State Fire Prevention Commission (the “Commission”) with respect to the above-referenced disciplinary matters.

**NATURE OF THE PROCEEDINGS**

Pursuant to due notice and 16 *Del. C.* § 6604(4), the Commission held a hearing on December 12, 2025, concerning allegations against Caryany Rosado-Collazo (“Respondent”).

Renee Hrvnak, Deputy Attorney General, presented the State’s case. Respondent did not appear. After the State presented appropriate notice,<sup>1</sup> the hearing continued *in absentia*.

## **FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Commission accepts the facts as presented in the State's Amended Complaint and introduced as Ex. 1. Respondent is an EMT in the State of Delaware. Respondent transported Victim J.D. to Christiana Hospital while acting in her capacity as an EMT. Respondent took a credit card belonging to Victim J.D. and used it without permission on multiple occasions.

Respondent was arrested and charged with Theft Under \$1500 where Victim is 62 Years of Age or Older and Unlawful Use of a Payment Card under \$1500 where Victim is 62 years of Age or Older (6 counts); both criminal offenses are felonies. She pled guilty to Financial Exploitation of a Patient, a misdemeanor, pursuant to 16 *Del. C.* §1136, on August 25, 2025.

## **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Respondent violated Regulation 18.4.1.7 by engaged in the unprofessional conduct of Exploitation of a Patient. Not only is the offense an enumerated convicted under the definition of unprofessional conduct.<sup>2</sup> Theft of a credit card from a patient in the hospital breaches the trust bestowed upon EMTs by the community. This behavior was both dishonorable and unethical. Respondent's behavior is dangerous to vulnerable people. Respondent harmed Victim J.D. in taking the credit card and further harmed her in using the credit card.

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




