## **CONSENT AGREEMENT**

A written Complaint and Motion for Temporary Suspension (“Complaint”) has been filed with the Delaware State Fire Prevention Commission (“Commission”) alleging that Raymond M. Lyons (“Respondent”), an emergency medical technician (“EMT”) in the State of Delaware, license number 32013, has engaged in conduct which constitutes grounds for discipline under 16 *Del. C. Ch. 67* and the Delaware State Fire Prevention Regulations.

Respondent and the State, by the undersigned Deputy Attorney General, hereby enter into this Consent Agreement to be submitted to the Commission for review and approval.

**IT IS UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED THAT:**

1. Respondent is a resident of Delaware City, Delaware and is certified as an emergency medical technician ("EMT") in Delaware pursuant to the provisions of 16 *Del. C. Ch.* 67.
2. Respondent's EMT certification, I.D. Number 388 was originally issued on March 31, 2006, and expires on March 31, 2026. His certification is currently active.
3. On November 22, 2025, Respondent was arrested on the following charges: Strangulation, a felony, in violation of 11 Del. C. §607, and Menacing, a misdemeanor, in violation of 11 Del. C. §602.
4. On December 3, 2025, the State filed a Complaint and Request for Temporary Suspension with the Commission. Thereafter, on December 3, 2025, the Commission entered an

Order approving the request for temporary suspension.

5. The State's Complaint alleges that during a domestic violence incident on November 22, 2025, Respondent strangled the victim and lunged at her like he was going to hit her and then punched the couch next to her head.

6. The State's Complaint alleges that while speaking with Respondent, Respondent advised the police that he put his hands around the victim's neck knowing she could possibly no longer breathe and that he could have possibly punched the couch next to the victim's head.

7. The State's Complaint alleges Respondent failed to report his arrest to the Fire Commission as required under Regulation 710, Section 18.8.1.1 and 18.8.1.2.

8. Respondent and the State agree that Respondent's EMT license will continue to be temporarily suspended until Respondent makes a written request to the Commission for a hearing on the State's Complaint.

9. Respondent and the State agree that Respondent does not admit to the conduct alleged in the State's Complaint and that no inference of guilt is evidenced or implied by the terms of this Consent Agreement.

10. The parties to this Consent Agreement are the State of Delaware and Respondent.

11. The parties agree and acknowledge that nothing contained in this Consent Agreement shall affect any rights or interests of any person not a party to this Agreement.

12. Respondent acknowledges that he has carefully read and understands this Consent Agreement, and is entering into this Consent Agreement freely, knowingly, voluntarily, and after having received or having been afforded the opportunity to receive the advice of counsel.

13. Respondent acknowledges that this Consent Agreement is a public record within the meaning of 29 Del. C. § 10002 and will be available for public inspection and copying as

provided for by 29 Del. C. § 10003.

14. The parties acknowledge and agree that this Consent Agreement is subject to approval by the Commission.

15. The parties acknowledge and agree that if the Commission does not accept this Consent Agreement, it shall have no force or effect, except as follows:

- a. Neither Respondent, nor anyone on his behalf, will in any way or in any forum challenge the ability of the Commission or any of its members to conduct an evidentiary hearing relating to the allegations in the subject Complaint;
- b. The Consent Agreement, or conduct or statements made in negotiating the Consent Agreement, will be inadmissible at any administrative, civil or criminal legal proceeding; and
- c. No provision contained in the Agreement shall constitute or have the effect of an admission by the Respondent as to any fact alleged in the Complaint in this matter or in this Agreement.

16. If the Commission accepts the Consent Agreement and enters it as an Order, the Consent Agreement shall be admissible as evidence at any future proceedings before the Commission.

17. Respondent understands and acknowledges that the Commission will report this Consent Agreement to the licensing authority of any other state in which she is licensed to practice.

18. The parties acknowledge and agree that this Consent Agreement, along with any exhibits, addendums, or amendments hereto, encompasses the entire agreement of the parties and supersedes all previous understandings and agreements between the parties, whether oral or written. There are no other terms, obligations, covenants, representations, statements or

conditions, or otherwise, of any kind whatsoever concerning this agreement.

19. This Consent Agreement shall be effective upon acceptance by the Commission and entry of the Commission's Order.

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

**IT IS SO ORDERED** this 20th day of January, 2026.




