

not live there anymore and to get out. Respondent then raised a cocked fist towards his father-in-law, ready to hit his father-in-law. As a result, Respondent's father-in-law fled to his daughter/Respondent's wife's bedroom and woke her up.

5. The State's Complaint alleges that Respondent's wife then asked Respondent what was going on. Respondent grabbed his wife by the wrists and squeezed them causing pain and or discomfort. During this altercation, Respondent grabbed his wife by her nightshirt ripping it.

6. The State's Complaint alleges that Delaware State Police officers arrived at the residence and spoke to Respondent's wife and father-in-law. One police officer proceeded to look for Respondent in the residence, yelling for Respondent to come out. Respondent came around a corner with one fist cocked and the other hand trying to grab the police officer's hand that was holding his flashlight.

7. The State's Complaint alleges that Respondent was then taken into custody. At approximately 1125 hours, a Portable Breath Test was administered to Respondent with a result of .188% BAC.

8. The State's Complaint alleges that on December 28, 2025, Respondent was arrested on the following charges: two counts of Menacing, a misdemeanor, in violation of 11 *Del. C.* §602; and one count of Offensive Touching, a misdemeanor, in violation of 11 *Del. C.* §601.

9. The State's Complaint alleges that Respondent has violated Regulation 710, Section 18.4.1.5 in that he has violated or aided or abetted in the violation of any provision of this regulation.

10. The State's Complaint alleges that Respondent has violated Regulation 710, Section 18.4.1.7 of the Delaware State Fire Prevention Regulations in that he has engaged in "unprofessional conduct".

11. The State's Complaint alleges that Respondent violated Regulation 710, Section 18.4.2.3 because Respondent's above-described conduct was dishonorable, unethical, or other conduct likely to deceive, defraud, or harm the public.

12. The State's Complaint alleges that Respondent violated Regulation 710, Section 18.4.2.7 in that he abused or misused alcohol.

13. Respondent and the State agree that Respondent's EMT certification in the State of Delaware will continue to be temporarily suspended until either party makes a written request to the Commission for a hearing on the State's Complaint, a hearing is held before the Commission, and the Commission issues a final order on the State's Complaint.

14. By signing this Consent Agreement, Respondent understands and agrees that his temporary suspension will continue beyond the statutorily mandated 60-day period set forth in Ambulance Service Regulation 710, Section 18.4.7. and until such time as the Commission issues a final order on the State's Complaint.

15. The temporary suspension will not terminate except by Order of the Commission.

16. Respondent understands that if his certification lapses or expires while the State's Complaint is pending, the disciplinary case remains open and the suspension order remains operative until the Complaint is resolved.

17. Respondent and the State agree that Respondent does not admit the conduct alleged in the State's Complaint and that no inference of guilt is evidenced or implied by the terms of this Consent Agreement.

18. Respondent and the State agree that Respondent's EMT license will continue to be temporarily suspended until Respondent makes a written request to the Commission for a hearing on the State's Complaint.

19. The parties to this Consent Agreement are the State of Delaware and Respondent.

20. The parties agree and acknowledge that nothing contained in this Consent Agreement shall affect any rights or interests of any person not a party to this Agreement.

21. Respondent acknowledges that he has carefully read and understands this Consent Agreement, and is entering into this Consent Agreement freely, knowingly, voluntarily, and after having received or having been afforded the opportunity to receive the advice of counsel.

22. Respondent acknowledges that this Consent Agreement is a public record within the meaning of 29 *Del. C.* § 10002 and will be available for public inspection and copying as provided for by 29 *Del. C.* § 10003.

23. The parties acknowledge and agree that this Consent Agreement is subject to approval by the Commission.

24. The parties acknowledge and agree that if the Commission does not accept this Consent Agreement, it shall have no force or effect, except as follows:

- a. Neither Respondent, nor anyone on his behalf, will in any way or in any forum challenge the ability of the Commission or any of its members to conduct an evidentiary hearing relating to the allegations in the subject Complaint;
- b. The Consent Agreement, or conduct or statements made in negotiating the Consent Agreement, will be inadmissible at any administrative, civil or criminal legal proceeding; and
- c. No provision contained in the Agreement shall constitute or have the effect of an admission by the Respondent as to any fact alleged in the Complaint in this matter or in this Agreement.


25. If the Commission accepts the Consent Agreement and enters it as an Order, the

Consent Agreement shall be admissible as evidence at any future proceedings before the Commission.

26. Respondent understands and acknowledges that the Commission will report this Consent Agreement to the licensing authority of any other state in which he is licensed to practice.

27. The parties acknowledge and agree that this Consent Agreement, along with any exhibits, addendums, or amendments hereto, encompasses the entire agreement of the parties and supersedes all previous understandings and agreements between the parties, whether oral or written. There are no other terms, obligations, covenants, representations, statements or conditions, or otherwise, of any kind whatsoever concerning this agreement.

28. This Consent Agreement shall be effective upon acceptance by the Commission and entry of the Commission's Order.


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
ORDER






